THE BASKETBALL CORE

Centrally placed, a basketball seamlessly merges with the lily, symbolizing the unity of sport and nature and anchoring the championship's core identity. The integration reflects balance, motion, and purpose.

VICTORIA AMAZONICA WATER LILY

At the heart of the logo lies Guyana's national flower, the Victoria Amazonica Water Lily. Its broad petals form a strong base, representing stability, strength, and fertile ground for the growth of athletic talent.

GUYANA 2025 grounds the logo, linking past achievements (1996 victory, 2016 hosting) to a new era of progress in 2025.

CARIBBEAN WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP

The name of the event, "CARIBBEAN WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP," defining the regional scope of the competition and emphasis on the female athletes who are the focus of the tournament.

BLOOM OF CHAMPIONS

This dynamic and symbolic logo celebrates the 2025 FIBA Caribbean Women's Championship, hosted by Guyana. The design is a powerful visual metaphor for the growth and blossoming of women's basketball throughout the region. At the core of the logo is Guyana's national flower, the magnificent Victoria Amazonica Water Lily, which serves as the foundation. Its large, iconic petals forms a robust base, symbolizing strength, stability, and the fertile ground from which athletic talent grows. Radiating from the center of the lily are the flower's own veins, subtly mirrored by dynamic lines that suggest both the motion of the game and the sun's rays over the Caribbean. Proudly centered upon this national emblem is a basketball, seamlessly integrated to represent the championship's core purpose. The ball's lines interact with the veins of the lily, creating a harmonious fusion of sport and nature.

The Water Lily is profoundly symbolic on multiple levels:

- National Pride: It proudly identifies Guyana as the host nation, anchoring the event in its unique natural heritage.
- Growth and Potential: Just as the lily grows from the water to bloom magnificently on the surface, the logo symbolizes the tremendous growth, rising potential, and flourishing status of women's basketball in Guyana and the wider Caribbean.
- Beauty and Strength: The Victoria Amazonica is known for its stunning beauty and remarkable resilience, able to support significant weight and thrive in its environment. This perfectly parallels the athleticism, grace, and power of the female athletes competing in this championship.

Surrounding this central image are the bold, clean lines of the text:

- The acronym "FIBA" sits at the very top, establishing the official governing body and the international importance of the event.
- The name of the event, "CARIBBEAN WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP," defining the regional scope of the competition and emphasis on the female athletes who are the focus of the tournament.
